## Carnivorous Pitcher Plants and Venus Flytraps Sarracenia and Dionaea Muscipula

Best outdoors in container/pot in saucer or tray. Yellow trumpet, parrot pitcher and Venus Flytrap need 5+ hours direct sunlight in growing season.







**Containers/planting:** place pot in plastic container with standing water with drain holes/slits at bottom to avoid stagnant soil. Or, plant in a laundry tub or wading pool with side drain holes to create a small bog.

**Water:** Keep soil wet. Rainwater best; tap water OK.

**Soil**: for Sarracenia use peat and perlite (2:1 or 1:1). Same for Venus Flytrap or 1/3 sand and 2/3 sphagnum moss. No compost, fertilizer, potting soil or lime. Change soil every 2-3 years in spring.

Winterizing: (Nov – Feb.) Sarracenia and Venus Flytrap (VTF) become dormant. Leaves turn brown; must keep watered. Below 20 °, cover plants with 2 layers of remay; no mulching necessary. VFT can't stand over 1 week of freezing temps. Sarracenia revives in spring, self-propagating; may be thinned every 3 years. VTF revives if kept watered and in moderate environment; switching indoors/outdoors not recommended.
